Education

Ludhiana District's 10th and 12th class regular results of the session 2022-2023 have been excellent thanks to the hard work of all the teachers, school principals and students. Health



Poshan Abhiyaan scheme aims to improve the nutritional status of adolescent girls, pregnant women, lactating mothers, and children aged 0-6 years. To date, 98% of the total beneficiaries of the Supplementary Nutrition Program of the District have been uploaded and monitored by the Poshan Tracker app. Training programs are being conducted throughout the district by Poshan coordinators.



The projects undertaken by the National Highway Authority of India are on the verge of completion. The Elevated Highway on NH-05 is expected to open by the 15th of July. The first leg of the Bharatnagar Flyover on the railway station side nears completion, while the other leg (ISBT side) will be finished by September. The recently commenced Ludhiana-Rupnagar (Pkg-I) is gaining momentum too with 7.5% progress.


51 Aam Aadmi Clinics have been throughout opened l udhiana district. Hon'ble Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann and Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) national convenor Shri Arvind Kejriwal inaugurated 9 Clinics for District Ludhiana this month. So far an astounding 4,21,485 patients have received their treatment here. This brought up the total number of Aam Admi Clinics in the state to 580.

Employment

The District Bureau of Employment and Enterprises in collaboration with CICU organized a job fair at Focal Point. More than 100 companies participated. And a total of 2654 youths participated in the fair, out of which 1454 have been selected.

Youth in Urban Governance

DC Surabhi Malik and MC Commissioner Dr Shena Aggarwal flagged off the first fleet of buses carrying students for field tours. This signalled the start of the YUG (Youth in Urban Governance) initiative in Ludhiana, a joint venture between the District Administration, Municipal Corporation, and Ludhiana Smart City Limited. The objective is to promote the involvement of the youth in the city's governance by sensitizing them through field visits and sessions that help them appreciate the various facets of city administration including solid waste management, road safety, cybersecurity amongst others.

Hands-on learning accompanied by the inculcation of civic manners will mould the youth into climate-conscious individuals and positive change-makers for the future.

Skilling

The District Education Officer, SE Mr. Harjit Singh, in collaboration with Training Coordinator Mr. Jasvir Singh, successfully conducted an extensive induction training program for 4161 newly appointed teachers in Meritorious School, Ludhiana. 178 newly appointed teachers from the district were present during the training.

The induction training, held from May 15 to May 31, aimed to equip the teachers with essential skills, knowledge, and resources to excel in their roles and contribute effectively to the education system of Ludhiana. The program covered a wide range of topics, including Civil Services rules, pedagogy, curriculum implementation, classroom management, assessment techniques, and educational technology integration.

Environment

A workshop aimed at promoting the utilization of canal water instead of ground water was held at Meritorious School in Ludhiana. The workshop was organized under the guidance of Harjit Singh, District Education Officer SE, and Jasvir Singh, District Science Mentor.

The workshop, conducted on May 26 for Government High Schools and May 27 for Government Senior Secondary Schools, aimed to raise awareness among school authorities about the benefits of utilizing canal water as an alternative water source. The event emphasized the importance of preserving ground water resources and promoting sustainable water management practices.

During the workshop, participants were provided with valuable insights and practical knowledge on efficient water management techniques, including the collection, storage, and distribution of canal water. Various experts and resource persons delivered informative sessions, highlighting the significance of reducing dependence on ground water and promoting the use of readily available canal water.
